VISA INFORMATION – Internet

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia has kindly agreed that all the participants of the 2015 EBRD Annual Meeting in Tbilisi, as well as accompanying persons, **will be exempted from visa requirements from 1st to 31st May 2015.**

According to the above agreement, those persons who would normally require a visa in order to travel to Georgia, will not require one providing they are in possession of the following items when travelling:

- A valid travel document
- A printed copy of the [Visa Exemption letter](#) issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia
- A letter of invitation from EBRD (to support the visa exemption agreement)

To establish whether you or the person on whose behalf you are acting would normally require a visa to travel to Georgia, please consult the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia on www.mfa.gov.ge

All diplomatic missions of Georgia worldwide have been informed about the visa waiver agreement and will be able to provide guidance if Annual Meeting participants approach them for information.
